**Unryūzan Shōkōji Temple (Ruins of Etschū Provincial Office)**  
 <National Treasure> <Nationally Designated Important Cultural Property>  
 The large temple symbolizes the Shinshū Kingdom of Etschū. A branch of the Honganji Temple, it has been a symbol of power and influence in the Kaga Maeda family and the nobility. In the vast precincts of the temple, the main hall, the great hall, and the two coronal platforms have been designated as National Treasures, and its other 10 buildings have been designated as Important Cultural Properties.  
 [Fee] Adults 500 yen / Junior High School Students 200yen / Elementary School Students 100 yen / Pre-schoolers and younger enter free  
 [Opening Hours] March - November: 9:00 - 16:30 (Last Admission at 16:00)  
 December to February: 9:00 - 16:00 (Last Admission at 15:30)

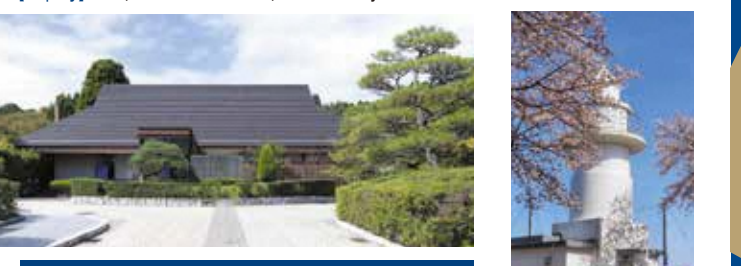
**Etchū-ko-ichinomiya Keta Shrine**  
 <Nationally Designated Important Cultural Property>  
 It is said the monk Gyōki founded Keta Shrine in 718. With its grand image, it is one of the finest examples of Japanese shrine architecture. Created in the traditional Shinto architectural style of sangan-sha nagare-zukuri in which the four pillars at the main entrance of the shrine create three gaps between them.

**Man'yō Wharf Green Space**

**Takaoka CCI Fushiki Branch (Former Fushiki Bank)**  
 <Nationally Registered Tangible Cultural Property>  
 Built over 100 years ago, this building is representative of Fushiki's architecture in the Meiji and Taishō eras, inspired by Western-style designs.

**Fushiki Kitamae-bune Museum**  
 <Takaoka City Designated Cultural Property>  
 The former residence of the Akimoto family - a family of ship owners - was transformed into a museum where you can learn all about the history of Fushiki and Kanbara ships. The watchtower remains and is open to visitors.

**Takaoka City Fushiki Meteorological Museum**  
 <Nationally Registered Tangible Cultural Property>  
 Established in 1893 as Japan's first private weather station and one of the 15 sites for calculating the average temperature in Japan, it has been recording meteorological data for over 100 years.

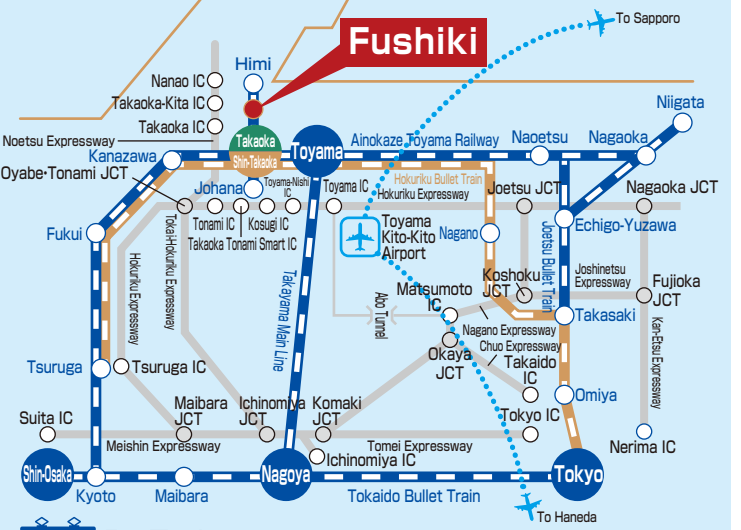
**Amaharashi Coast, Yoshitsune Rocks**

**What is Fushiki like?**

The Fushiki region of Takaoka City is called the home of the Man'yō, as it is home to the Man'yōshū (Collection of Myriad Leaves), Japan's oldest anthology of poems. Its main author and compiler, the Man'yō poet Ōtomo no Yakamochi, was assigned to this area as the governor in the Nara period. Inspired by the beautiful landscape, Yakamochi composed most of his poems while living here. Yakamochi composed poems on the coastline with unique rocks, white sands, and green pines against the magnificent Tateyama mountain range soaring high above the sea. These breathtaking views continue to captivate people today. Today, the National Treasure of Shōkōji Temple lies in what is considered the ruins of the Etchū government, and it played a leading role in the Ikko Ikkō rebellion movement. During the Edo Period, the temple came under the protection of the Maeda family, acting as a liaison between officials and the Etchū Shin Buddhism temples. The Shōkōji temple has prospered throughout modern times, and its National Treasure designations and temple precincts, which remain intact as they were in the late Edo period, are a sight to behold. Prospering since ancient times as a great port with nature, Fushiki flourished as a port for Kitamaebune ships in the latter half of the Edo Period. In the Meiji Period (1868-1912), it was the first Japanese port facing the Sea of Japan to build a western-style lighthouse and weather station and was one of the first ports to promote modernization. Fushiki has thrived as one of the best trading ports along the Sea of Japan and is known for its beautiful nature, rich history and culture, and port town traditions passed down over generations. Take a relaxing walk and discover the charms of Fushiki!
